## Mohican North Star Interim GM

Terrance "Moonie" Miller is the interim General Manager of the Mohican North Star Resort Casino until a new General Manager is hired. Moonie brings 29 years of experience with him to the position. He is the Facilities and Security Director at the casino.

We asked what goals he had for the casino while he is in charge. Terrance said management's current goal is to review all current services and amenities not in operation at this time and find ways to bring such services back even if in a limited capacity for now. Also, to grow business levels, reopen more venues, provide more amenities and expand operational hours in a safe manner and continue to be a strong economic generator for the Stockbridge-Munsee Nation. He is working with the staff, and he emphasized at all levels, for ideas and suggestions on how to improve. He pointed out that there is less staff at the casino presently, but they are working diligently and keeping pace with the current level of business. He also stressed that while there are some vacant positions at the casino resort,

management is looking to see improved business levels and the return of additional amenities and services before filling some of these positions.

The casino has instituted a number of current and future health initiatives. They include but are not limited to:

- All current health and safety efforts are still in place. Plexi-glass barriers installed for Social Distancing.
- Hand sanitization and cleaning wipes throughout the entire property.
- Property patron capacity will be limited to less than 20%.
- All guests and team members will be required to participate in a non-invasive health screen and temperature check.
- All guests and team members must adhere to properly wearing an appropriate face mask while inside the casino resort. If you do not have a face mask, one will be provided for you.
- To protect the health and safety of our guests, team members, and community, the casino resort will remain a

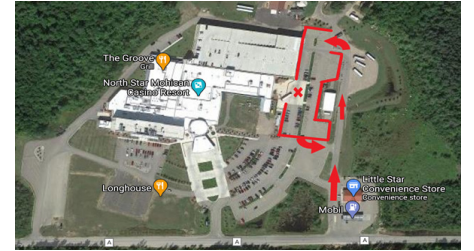

## The 2021 Wisconsin Wolf Hunt

If you have information regarding the illegal killing of this animal please contact the Conservation Department at 715-793-4364. **(Editor's Note: You may ask yourself, how important are wolves to the Stockbridge-Munsee? They are still looking for this poacher from 2011).**

On January 4<sup>th</sup>, 2021 the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources (WDNR) resumed management authority of wolves in Wisconsin due to the federal delisting of the grey wolf. The WDNR planned to conduct a wolf hunt, mandated by state law, in fall of 2021. The WDNR felt this would allow adequate time to collect public comment, set the quota, plan the

hunt, and also consult with the tribes. On January 21, 2021 a special Natural Resource Board (NRB) meeting was called due to pressure from state legislators to immediately implement a wolf harvest season. SMC provided public testimony at this meeting, asking the board to vote no due to the lack of tribal consultation. The **Wolves continued on pg Seven:**

The Stockbridge-Munsee Community ("Tribe"), a federally recognized Indian tribe, through the Mohican News is issuing this Request for Proposals (RFP) to contract with a qualified printing company to perform general printing services for our Tribal paper called the Mohican News.

It is the intent of this RFP to solicit proposals from all interested companies possessing expertise in commercial printing.

**II. SCHEDULE:** Sealed proposals for the services requested in the RFP will be received until Friday, March 26, 2021 at 4:00 pm, Central Daylight Time. Proposal must be identified as being "Mohican News Printing Bids" on the outside of the envelope. Proposals shall be delivered to the:

The Tribe anticipates that a successful bidder will be selected by the Tribal Council on or about April 20, 2020.

**III. PROJECT AND SCOPE OF SERVICES**  
Print paper 9-3/4 x 14 size  
16 pages for bid purposes (may print 8 pages, but rarely over 20)  
1,600 copies required except for one or two times per year when 3,000 may be required.  
Full color  
Printer provides mailing with list provided for each issue  
Printer mails a box of extra issues to Bowler address provided

**IV. Compensation / Reimbursement** Successful bidder will pay for postage of mailing copies and be reimbursed within the invoice for printing.

**V. Cost Proposal**  
Each bidder will provide a detailed listing of the estimated fees for the services outlined above.

**VI. Duration of Contract**  
We are seeking terms in a three to five-year contract.

**VII. Terms of Contract**  
The successful bidder will be required to enter into a written contract with the Tribe. The successful bidder must not engage in discriminatory conduct and may not be a barred contractor under tribal or federal contracting requirements.

## VA offers cont. debt relief options to Veterans

WASHINGTON—The Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) reaffirms its commitment to extend debt relief for Veterans through Sept. 30.

VA will continue suspension of collection on all Veteran benefit overpayments and medical copayment debts incurred after April 1, 2020

VA is suspending this debt collection to provide Veterans continued financial relief due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

“My top priority right now is to do everything in our power to help our Veterans, caregivers and their families get through this challenging COVID-19 pandemic,” said VA Secretary Denis McDonough. “VA will continue to find ways to provide real relief to 2 million Veterans and their families

as we fight through this health crisis together.”

To assist with making informed choices for their situation, VA will notify Veterans of the existence of their current debt and available expansive relief options. These options include making payments, extending repayment plans, waivers, compromises and temporary hardship suspensions.

Veterans and beneficiaries with questions regarding benefit overpayments can see frequently asked questions, go online to submit requests or call 800-827-0648. Call volume is generally lower Tuesday – Friday.

For health care co-payment debts, Veterans should contact the Health Resource Center at 866-400-1238 for payments.

## Frequently Asked Questions Face Mask Information

These FAQs contain up-to-date information related to Face Mask.

### Why should I wear a face mask?

Correct and consistent mask use is a critical step everyone can take to prevent getting and spreading COVID-19. Masks work best when everyone wears them, but not all masks provide the same protection. When choosing a mask, look at how well it fits, how well it filters the air, and how many layers it has.

### How can I improve how my mask will protect me?

Make sure your mask fits snugly against your face. Gaps can let air with respiratory droplets leak in and out around the edges of the mask.

Choose a mask with a Nose Wire

- A nose wire is a metal strip along the top of the mask
- Nose wires prevent air from leaking out of the top of the mask. Bend the nose wire over your nose to fit Use a close to your face Mask Fitter or Brace
- Use a mask fitter or brace over a

disposable mask or a cloth mask to prevent air from leaking around the edges of the mask. Pick a mask with layers to keep your respiratory droplets in and others' out. A mask with layers will stop more respiratory droplets getting inside your mask or escaping from your mask if you are sick. Make sure you can see and breathe easily! Check that it Fits Snugly over your nose, mouth, and chin

• Check for gaps by cupping your hands around the outside edges of the mask.

• Make sure no air is flowing from the area near your eyes or from the sides of the mask.

• If the mask has a good fit, you will feel warm air come through the front of the mask and may be able to see the mask material move in and out with each breath.

• Gaps can let air with respiratory droplets leak in and out around the edges of the mask. Add Layers of material 2 ways to layer

• Use a cloth mask that has multiple layers of fabric.

- Wear one disposable mask underneath a cloth mask.
- The second mask should push the edges of the inner mask against your face. Knot and Tuck ear loops of a 3-ply mask
- Knot the ear loops of a 3-ply face mask where they join the edge of the mask
- Fold and tuck the unneeded material under the edges

### What are the types of facemasks?

There are many types of masks you can use to protect yourself and others from getting and spreading COVID-19. Cloth masks can be made from a variety of fabrics, and many types of cloth masks are available. Do not wear cloth masks with exhalation valves or vents, single layer or masks made of thin fabric that don't block light. Disposable face masks are widely available. Do not wear disposable masks with gaps around the sides of the face or nose, or if wet or dirty.

### When should I wear a facemask?

• Anytime you are indoors or outdoors with people who don't live with you.

• Riding on planes, buses, trains, or other forms of public transportation, especially when you can't keep at least 6 feet away from people who don't live with you

• Taking care of someone who is sick with COVID-19

• Working at a job where you interact with large numbers of the public. Examples of jobs might include bus drivers and grocery store workers

• If you are at increased risk for severe illness, for example, older adults or people with certain underlying medical conditions

### Where can I get facemask?

The Stockbridge-Munsee Health & Wellness Center has facemasks available at the registration desk. The Emergency Preparedness Office (former education office) has facemasks available. The Mohican Family Center has facemask available.

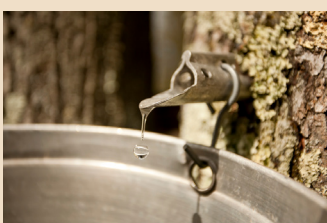

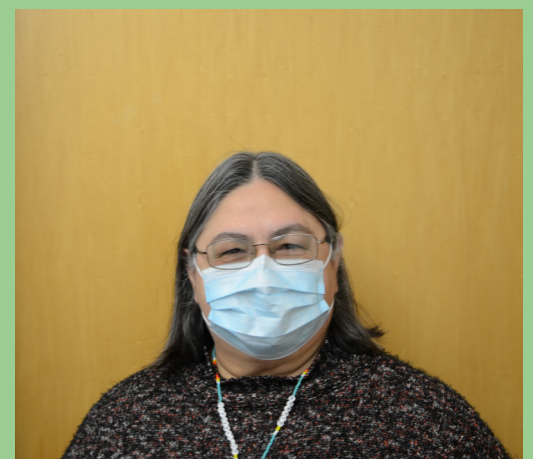

- smoke-free facility until further notice. Outdoor smoking area available.
- Additional information about our health and safety efforts are available online or in-person at North Star. Please follow all safety direction provided by our team for everyone to stay safe.
- As a precautionary step all of our employees have been tested for Covid 19 prior to

returning to work. Regular testing will continue.

- The casino is open 7 AM – 3 AM Sunday through Thursday; and 24 hours on Friday and Saturday.

Moonie said they are slightly ahead in play for the market and they are always looking for improvement. Terrance ended the interview by saying, "If you think you are good, you can always be doing better". We hope so Moonie!

NRB did vote no to this request based on a lack of consultation and the short time frame afforded to the WDNR to set up a wolf harvest season. Following this decision, the Wisconsin Institute for Law and Liberty filed a lawsuit on behalf of Hunter Nation, Inc. in Jefferson County, the judge presiding over the lawsuit determined the state was mandated to hold a wolf hunt and that the wolf hunt was to start immediately. Another special NRB meeting was scheduled for February 15, 2021 due to this court decision. SMC provided written comments at this meeting, since there was no public testimony allowed, once again focusing on the lack of tribal consultation. Despite the clear lack of tribal

consultation, the NRB members voted yes to an immediate wolf hunt which would start on February 22, 2021. The WDNR appealed the Jefferson County court decision but the Wisconsin Court of Appeals denied their request due to the fact the appellate court felt it did not have jurisdiction over the appeal. A quota of 200 wolves was set by the WDNR and that number was reduced to 119 wolves for the general public as the tribes in the ceded territory were entitled to 50% of the harvest in the ceded territory. The hunt began on February 22 and ended on February 24 due to the quota being met. SMC staff patrolled the reservation during this time to ensure the public did not attempt

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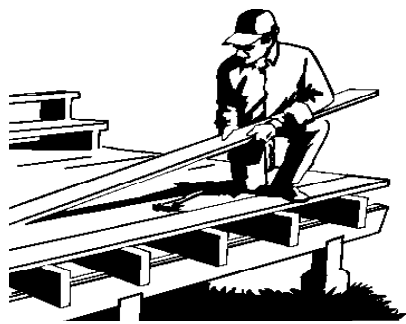

to harvest wolves in this area due to a "no harvest" zone previously negotiated with the WDNR. The Miller Creek Pack (SMC's resident wolf pack) was not targeted and they appear to have made it through the wolf hunt intact. While this season is over, a new season is set to begin on November 6, 2021 and this could once again endanger the Miller Creek Pack.

SMC staff will continue to work with Tribal Council in the upcoming months to ensure the updated Wisconsin Wolf Management Plan and any future hunts provide the tribe with the ability to protect and manage its natural resources as the tribe sees fit. A follow-up article focusing on the specifics and history of the Miller Creek Pack will appear in next edition of the Mohican News.

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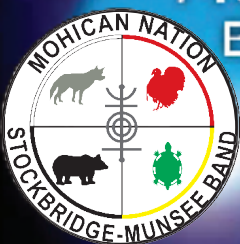


Seek the advice of registered dietitian nutritionists — the food and nutrition experts who can help develop individualized eating and activity plans to meet people's health goals. To find a registered dietitian nutritionist near you, use the Academy's online Find an Expert service.

Ehsani recommends tips to reimagine traditional dishes:

- Cook with dried spices and herbs instead of salt to add flavor to your dishes
- Try different grains such as wild rice, whole-grain farro and whole-grain barley to reap the benefits of whole grains
- Go meatless: Serve up beans or lentils for a heart healthful plant-based protein
- Cook with vegetable oils instead of solid fats such as butter when cooking to limit saturated fat
- Eat 100-percent whole-wheat bread instead of white bread for more dietary fiber
- To decrease extra calories from fat, bake, grill, roast or steam your food instead of frying
