INTERNSHIP TITLE: Archeological Student Intern

LOCATION: Menominee Cultural Museum & College of Menominee Nation - SDI

TERM: This internship is approximately 8 weeks in the spring semester, and 10 weeks in the summer.

APPLICATION DUE: February 26, 2021. Applications may be considered after the due date if positions have not been filled.

Internship Summary and Description

The student internship is being offered through the Sustainable Development Institute (SDI) of the College of Menominee Nation (CMN), funded through a USDA – NIFA grant. This internship is part of an ongoing study under the direction of Dr. David Overstreet, adjunct professor at CMN and Dr. William Gartner, Department of Geography, University of Wisconsin – Madison. In the past five years SDI has conducted field research at (5) prehistoric agricultural sites on the Menominee Reservation in collaboration with the Menominee Historic Preservation Department. Following training on artifact recognition and understanding of research protocols the intern will join this research team.

Internship Responsibilities and Learning Objectives

By the end of the internship you will be able to:

- Recognize artifacts
- Understand research protocol
- Record data from the research
- Attend a virtual field conference
- Participate in the 2021 Indigenous Planning Summer Institute
- Create a poster and/or other media that reflects what you have learned by the internship.
- Participate in the annual report-out to the community.

Other responsibilities include:

- Work independently and with a team to perform the duties needed to complete the project.
- Participate in approved meetings, and SDI events.
- Getting along with others and having fun.

Program Requirements/Qualifications:

- Must be registered or currently enrolled in six (6) or more credits
- Must be a degree seeking student enrolled at the College of Menominee Nation or other accredited College or University. (Certain documentation may be required to confirm enrollment status.)
- Must have completed at least one (1) semester of study
- Student must be 18 years of age or older.
- Must have a cumulative GPA of 2.5 or better on a 4.0 scale.
- Internship must be related to students' academic degree program.
- Some basic archeological knowledge is preferred but not necessary.

Internship Program Application requires the following:

- Application Form
- Current Resume (Include any past internship experience)
- Transcripts and/or Grades (unofficial or official)
- Letter of Interest
- Letter of Recommendation (preferably a professor at his/her institution)

Timeframe and Stipend (if applicable):

The internship is scheduled to begin in the 2021 Spring Semester and run summer. Interns will be compensated via stipend in an amount not exceeding \$10,080. During the semester, it is requested that the intern schedule does not conflict with their academic schedule. The internship may be extended or hours adjusted based on student availability, interest, and funding.
