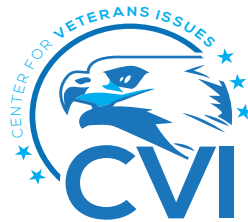

Our Focus

The suicide prevention program is centered on improving the Veteran's well-being and baseline mental health status while providing social support and connection to VA and community-based resources.

Eligibility

- ✓ **SERVED IN THE MILITARY**
Discharged or released under conditions other than dishonorable.
- ✓ **SCREENING**
Mental Health and well-being screening to verify some risk factors for suicide.
- ✓ **FOUND TO BE AT RISK**
Be evaluated and found to be at risk of suicide using the Columbia-Suicide Severity Rating Scale (C-SSRS)

Family Member Eligibility

- Over the age of 18
- Only eligible to begin services after an eligible Veteran is enrolled and engaged in the program

CASE MANAGEMENT

- Coordination of supportive services based on the administered Needs Assessment
- Development and monitoring of an Individualized Service Plan (ISP)
- Connection to VA and non-VA suicide prevention services
- Referrals to community resources, activities, and peer support specialists
- Providing educational material on recognizing suicidal thinking and lethal means safety
- Connection to services for transportation, income support, child care, and more

1. Eligibility Criteria:

- Actively served in the military, discharged or released under conditions other than dishonorable.
- Screening; mental health and well-being screening to verify some risk factors for suicide.
- Found to be at risk of suicide at some point in the veteran's life; be evaluated using the Columbia-Suicide Severity Rating Scale (C-SSRS)
- Family Members: Family members of veterans over the age of 18 can begin services after an eligible veteran is enrolled and is engaged in the program.

2. Wrap around Services:

- SSG Fox SPGP (Staff Sergeant Fox Suicide Prevention Grant Program); Needs Assessment, Individualized Service Plan (ISP's), Connection to Services VA and Non-VA Suicide prevention services, Referrals to community resources and peer support specialist, Education on recognizing suicidal thoughts, Emergent Needs Assistance.
- HVRP (Homeless Veterans Reintegration Program); On-site Employment Requirement, Resume Writing, Career Counseling, Job Club, Online Job Search and Application Assistance, Interview Techniques, Job Placement.
- SSVF (Supportive Services for Veteran Families); Rental Assistance, Security Deposits / Utilities, Rental and Utility Assistance, Child Care Costs, Moving Costs and Short-Term Storage, and Emergency Supplies.
- PSH (Permanent Supportive Housing); Employment and Training Assistance, Claims Advocacy, and Legal Assistance.

3. Benefits / Offer for Veterans:

- A. SSG Fox SPGP will fund Food on an emergency need only (No Regulatory Limit)

- B. SSG Fox SPGP SPCM's will fund Childcare, must be a licensed provider; \$5000 calendar year limit.

- C. SSG Fox SPGP SPCM's will fund transportation, Transportation funds will be tied to a service plan goal such as employment, childcare, etc. Transportation funds include:
 - Uber, Taxi, Bus tickets etc.
 - Car Insurance (limited to \$350.00 per veteran annually)
 - Utilities for housing and rental assistance on a case-by-case basis.
 - Furniture on a case-by-case basis.

- D. SSG Fox SPGP will fund general stability financial assistance as well. General Stability Funds are limited to \$750.00 per calendar year per eligible veteran. General stability funds include:
 - Employment related, Driver license, uniforms, tools etc.
 - Gun locks
 - Gun safes
 - Phone bill (limited to \$50 per veteran annually)
